THE WHY AND HOW OF PRAYER

Job is the most ancient of all the books in the Bible. Not surprisingly, then, it deals with questions and problems that people have asked since the dawn of human history. Ever since people were conscious of their obligation and allegiance to a Creator they have enquired regarding how best to establish and maintain a relationship with him. Job asks a question in 21:15 that is central to this relationship: "What is the Almighty that we should serve him? And what profit do we get if we pray?" Perhaps the best way to understand prayer's real value is by adding two other queries to Job's original one.

1. WHY SHOULD WE PRAY?

Because we cannot live the Christian life without it. It is the practice of prayer that keeps us from being stifled by the pressures of society. In essence, prayer is the Christian life. A lack of prayer may be an indication that the divine life has not yet taken root in our hearts. Its presence is a sure sign that God's grace has already started to transform us (Acts 9:11).

Because Jesus prayed. How strange to claim that Christ is our Saviour and Lord and yet fail to follow him in this essential aspect of his own earthly life. Jesus knew the importance and value of spending time alone with his Father. In this he is to be our example.

Because the Bible commands it. It is the original prayer book and cannot be improved upon. Time and again its pages introduce us to people who prayed. But more than that, it issues clear instruction regarding the practice in our own lives. Developing a decent prayer life is a matter of obedience, not feeling or even plain duty. And obedience always involves the will more than the emotions. Jesus both invites and instructs us to pray. There is a discipline that lies at the foundation of prayer which cannot be bypassed in constructing an effective prayer life.

Because God answers prayer. The great difference between the true God and every false deity is that He alone keeps His word and comes up with the goods. He will not jump at the snap of our fingers nor work precisely according to our timetable, but the one thing he will do is keep His promise.

Because we owe it to others. No matter what personal benefit we derive from prayer, it is basically an altruistic act. It focuses on God and it is performed with an eye on blessing coming to others. In fact, Samuel was of the opinion that to fail in our praying for others was actually a sin (1 Sam. 12:23). Not to pray for those with whom we are in relationship, or for whom we have a concern or a burden, is serious indeed.

2. HOW SHOULD WE PRAY?

What are the essentials for developing an effective life of prayer?

Pray regularly. When I am asked about available aids to prayer, I do not always suggest books or techniques. Sometimes the best thing to help you in prayer is an alarm clock in the morning and the TV remote in the evening. We need to make time for prayer and see it as nothing less than a rendezvous with God - an appointment we dare not miss.

Pray thankfully. Prayer is always more than a shopping list of wants. The great safeguard against treating it as such is to come into his courts with thanksgiving. Brother Andrew used to ask people who came to him for advice regarding prayer whether their prayers were “problem-centred or power-centred”. There is nothing like a good blast of genuine, overflowing, heartfelt gratitude for launching us into a realistic prayer time.

Pray honestly. What is the point of pretending anyway? Who could we ever possibly hope to kid, in this most personal of encounters with the all-seeing God? Realize that you are actually engaging in prayer when you say to him, “I don’t feel like praying” or “I don’t know where to start or what to say”. So many of the psalms are just honest outpourings of people’s deepest thoughts, feelings and desires. It goes without saying that being open with God about our

sinfulness is part of being honest with Him, and ourselves, when we pray (Psalm 66:18; 1 John 1:8).

Pray humbly. None of us will make any progress in prayer if we think we have nothing else to learn or that we cannot plunge any deeper. The prayer of Christ’s first disciples after listening in to Him praying, is perhaps the best prayer of all: “Lord, teach us to pray” (Luke 11:1). And it is sure of an answer when coupled with the highest prayer of all, “Not my will, but Yours be done”.

Pray now. What better time to put some of these great truths into practice than now? Taking to heart these simple lessons could be the start of an exciting journey into a more satisfying prayer life. It could also be the re-launching of a prayer life that has grown cold, formal and frustrating.

Lord, teach me how and what to pray!
