We are anticipating their arrival on August 25th. After a period of transition Timothy will assume full responsibility as General Director of The Faith Mission (in Canada). Converted as a young boy, Timothy grew up in a godly home and in a church where he was faithfully instructed in the word of God. During his final year in university, where he earned a Business degree, he was led to a place of full surrender of his life to God, soon after he heard God's clear call to ministry. The following year found him in The Faith Mission Bible College in Edinburgh, Scotland. After graduating from The Faith Mission college he did further studies in the CEF training institute in Switzerland and also obtained a degree in Biblical Theology from the Wales Evangelical School of Theology. He served for one year on the staff of his home church gaining valuable experience in local church ministry. For the past ten years he has been an evangelist with The Faith Mission four years in Canada and six in the UK. Emma is also a graduate of The Faith Mission Bible College. She has been in fulltime ministry with The Faith Mission for fourteen years, five in the UK and nine in Canada. We are very excited about their arrival and believe God has been preparing them to be channels of much blessing in Canada



On **Saturday September 29th** there will be a special dinner and rally at Calvary Church, Pape Avenue, Toronto, welcoming the Condy family back to Canada. Timothy will be the guest speaker. This past summer has been a great unexpected adventure. I fell in love with the Faith Mission ever since I went to YLT (Youth Leadership Training) sometime around March last year. There's just something about it, maybe it has to do with being surrounded with individuals who are very dedicated to the Lord and are mature in their faith, but I love to spend my time there. I signed up to help at the centre for the summer camp as the person in charge of taking photos... At least that's what I thought at first.

That was until Graham asked me to do an elective during tween and teen camp about the topic of Identity. I was hesitant at first because I didn't have the confidence to speak in front of kids just a couple years younger than me. Eventually, I said yes. I am so thankful for Graham because he really helped and coached me throughout the whole thing. It also lessened the shock of finding out I'm also going to be co-counselling. It was around that time when Jen asked me to help her at a VBS in Brussels. I was also just as nervous because I had an even bigger job of being at the front. It turns out I had no reason to worry because by the end of the week, I never wanted to leave. The Packers, our host for the week were so welcoming and even took me out on a couple adventures. I learned a lot from them, and I am so grateful I met them. On top of that, the kids from the VBS were so easy to love and even though it was a bit rough during my first time going up and teaching about the memory verse, I got more confident as the week went by. I also got to meet a lot of great kids, and talking with them helped my nervousness to go away. I learned a lot from watching Jen interact with the kids and was amazed at how she had all the kids' attention while she was telling the Bible stories and Reggie & Lina. She even got me eating out the palm of her hands. Looking back, the week in Brussels prepared me and gave me the confidence to speak during camp.

I didn't know what to expect for my first week at camp. It felt weird teaching these kids about Identity when I felt like I didn't even know my own identity at some point. But God is so so good. Things just fell into place, from our staff devotions in the morning with Graham unpacking the book of Galatians, and having our chapel times with Graeme Kirk in the afternoon, it all connected with my elective. God was equipping me with words to tell these kids. Each week was different from the other, with the age group and the roles I have been assigned. At teen camp, I was a co-counsellor and it was quite a rollercoaster since it was my first time. The next week, I got the job of being the photographer during tween camp and was in charge of the slideshow and the electives. It felt weird not being in charge of campers. Although it gave me more opportunity to talk to all the kids. Discovery camp was a mix of both the previous camp, I was co-counselling and doing the slideshow. It was just as amazing as the last two weeks.

I've learned a lot from this summer, teaching the electives taught me just as much (maybe even more) as I taught the kids. This summer showed me how much God will use someone as long as you continue to rely on Him and seek Him through everything. I've also been blessed with meeting fantastic people and built new friendships with the staff. Friendships that I know will last for years to come with people who are zealous for the Word of God and love God with all their hearts. Most of all, I loved seeing the kids know more about our awesome Father. There were many conversations throughout the weeks and seeing their eagerness to open the Bible and find verses made me feel so joyful and excited for what God has in store for them.
