You may remember that all through His life, Jesus rather discouraged the publication of His Messiahship. So distorted were the Jewish views of the Coming One, that to claim, it would have caused political trouble and complication in which He had no desire to be involved. But when the day came in which He stood before His infuriated judges, obviously on the verge of His doom, the time had come to speak plainly. Challenged as to whether He was the Christ, the Son of the Blessed, He boldly answered in the affirmative: "Nevertheless, I say to you, hereafter you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Power, and coming on the clouds of heaven." (Matt. 26:64)

The Cross to which they were assigning Him was the immediate step to the place of all power and the furthest future also was His. In Mark 16:19 we read: "So then, after the Lord had spoken to them, He was received up into heaven, and sat down at the right hand of God". How did they know this? He had not ascended far from them before: 'a cloud received Him out of their sight': their vision did not extend to the infinite distance and witness His welcome to God's right hand. But it was a reasoning of faith based upon three premises: 1.) Their ancient Scriptures had predicted it, in such passages as Psalm 2 and 110. 2.) The night before His betraval, Jesus had told them that such was His destination. 3.) The gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, according to the promises He had then made, confirmed the fact. All power was indeed His, both in heaven and on earth. It was a fact apprehended by faith, not by outward vision. The writer to the Hebrews affirmed confidently that, after making purification of sins, He "sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high" (Heb. 1:3). It was the successful completing of His redeeming work that entitled Him to this place: it was "because of the suffering of death" that He was "crowned with glory and honour" (Heb. 2:9). He was thereby authorized to open the kingdom of heaven to all believers. heaven rent at His Baptism, and remaining open throughout His life, stands open still today. The Divine communication with man which He introduced is not suspended.

We may note that Paul also declared that, when God raised His Son from the dead, He "set Him at His right hand in the heavenly places, far above all principality and power and might and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in that which is to come." (Eph. 1:20-21) In view of these passages it is surely a serious error to postpone the enthronement of our Saviour entirely to a future age, and to look for no great manifestation of His sovereign power through His church today. Stephen, the martyr, in his final hour, had not merely the faith-vision of the opened heaven, but the actual beholding of it. "But he, being full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God" (Acts 7:55). It was the assertion of this fact, which Jesus had predicted, that so maddened his judges that they stopped their ears, rushed upon him and stoned him.

Some have remarked upon the position here held by the ascended Jesus - "standing", instead of the usual 'sitting' - as if it were exceptional, in appearing to the first of His martyred saints. Doubtless there is some point to this; but we can never think of the enthroned Jesus in constant inactivity. The passage quoted from Mark, which tells of His exultation, says: "And they went out and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word through the accompanying signs" (Mark 16:20). This corresponds well with Luke's description of the earthly ministry as merely the beginning of the working and teaching of Jesus (Acts 1:1), and prepares us to recognize His continued operation through His church throughout the Acts of the Apostles. And that is obviously an unfinished book: the 'acts' have continued throughout the centuries, wherever He has found a people through whom He can operate.

The opened heavens means, of course, the establishment of association and intimacy between man and God. And the mediator of this is the Holy Spirit. When the clouds were torn apart at our Lord's baptism, it was for the decent of the Holy Spirit. Ascended to God's right hand, through the opened heaven He sends down the Holy Spirit. The heavens stand open: the Holy Spirit, blessed third person of the Holy Trinity, is available. It is not for us to ask God painfully the He would rend the heavens and come down. The heavens are permanently open: the Holy Spirit is proceeding forth from the Father and the Son. New Testament saints are not called to batter wildly at closed doors in sore uncertainly of answer. The prayer - "Arm of the Lord, awake" finds itself met by - "Awake, O Zion, put on your beautiful garments". "Did I not say to you that if you would believe you would see the glory of God?" (John 11:40).

And yet the believing has more in it than is generally reckoned. It has decided moral force. It involves the surrendered will, the renunciation of evil, the consecration of the life as a whole and in all its parts. It does involve, as Malachi said, the bringing of the whole tithe into the storehouses as the necessary condition of the outpoured blessing. You may remember how a prophet of the Old Testament had a vision of the opened heaven, and saw the temple there - the heavenly sanctuary, which the Lord pitched, and not man - the Lord enthroned in high state. The heavenly attendants were veiling their faces in His presence and crying: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts". In view of it, Isaiah felt himself utterly unclean, until the cleansing fire was applied to him. From that vision he carried forward a new title for the Most High: "The Holy One of Israel". John tells us in 12:41 that the One whom he saw thus exalted was the pre-incarnate Christ. And we, seeing Him restored - after His suffering of death for us - to the glory which He had with the Father before the world was (John 17:5), cannot but recognize Him as the all-holy one. With whom we cannot lightly claim fellowship. The Holy Spirit, whom He gives us, is not to be lightly received. Unless our hearts are willing to be adjusted for His incoming, we cannot have Him dwell in us effectually.

But, if the conditions be sincerely met, let us not seek or pray as those who beat the air. Let us have confidence that the heaven is opened, that the flood-gates are uplifted, that the Father's heart is toward us, more ready to bestow His Spirit upon us than the kindest earthly father is to give good things to his children. Let us make this prayer our own:

O thou exalted Son of God, High seated on Thy Father's throne, Thy Gift, the purchase of Thy blood, To us Thy waiting saints make known!

Fill every chamber of the soul: Fill all our thoughts, our passions fill, Till under Thy supreme control, Submissive rests our cheerful will.

Come, Holy Ghost, all-sacred Fire! Come, fill Thy earthly temples now, Emptied of every base desire; Reign Thou within, and only Thou.
