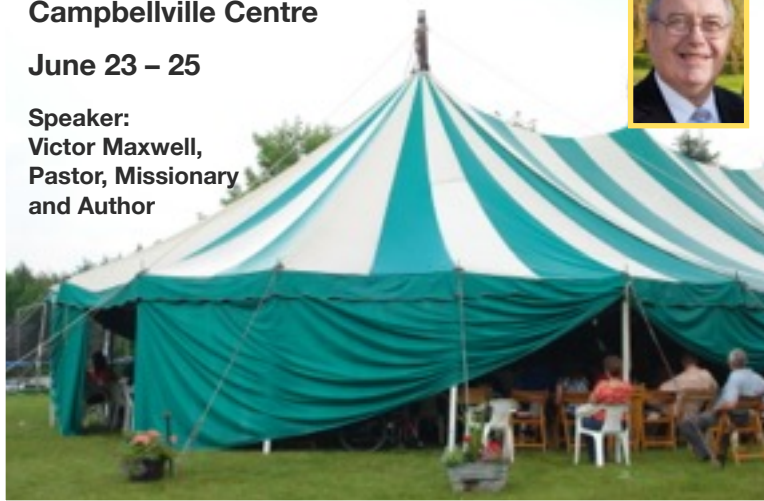

A video clip I saw in a church where I was preaching was of a pastor in Egypt sharing that once they had 200 people praying in his church and how this continued to increase until today there are 1,200 people praying. How gatherings like this must cause great joy in the heart of God. If Jesus was so angry to see the temple being used as a market place, how He must rejoice to see 1,200 people gathering weekly to pray. The sad news is It is the church under persecution that turns out in force to pray and the church in the west where there is minimal persecution sits at ease and largely prayerless while lost souls drift to hell. Thank God He is stirring His church. We have heard of a number of prayer initiatives taking place. Preaching in a church recently the chairman commented on the previous time I had been there. He shared how God spoke to a number of them on that occasion, challenging them to get together to pray. They have been meeting ever since and God has been searching their hearts and they have been putting things right with other people and with God.

Since last writing we had a most encouraging series of Christmas outreach banquets, sno' camps and Church services. We feel so humbled when God's presence fills a church giving great freedom to declare the glorious unchanging, life changing, sin destroying Gospel. Our cry as we minister through 2017 is for the 'much more of God'.

2017 is a significant year in the life of The Faith Mission (in Canada). On the 30<sup>th</sup> of September and 1<sup>st</sup> of October we look forward to celebrating the 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the work in Canada at a weekend of thanksgiving and celebration in Calvary church, Pape Avenue, Toronto. Dr. Charles Price is scheduled to be the guest speaker and we anticipate having all our Canadian staff join us for the occasion. Plans are in hand to publish a book documenting some of the great things God has done over the 90 years. In the coming months we hope to launch a revamped web site, a Youth Leadership Training course will be held March 12 – 16. Two ladies retreats will take place in Campbellville May 26 – 28 and June 2 – 4, Marjorie Bennett from N. Ireland is to speak. Victor Maxwell Pastor, Missionary and author of many books speaks at the Thirsting for God Bible conference at the Campbellville centre June 23 – 25. During July and August staff will be involved in camp and VBS ministry. Prayer will be appreciated for suitable camp counselors and summer VBS staff.

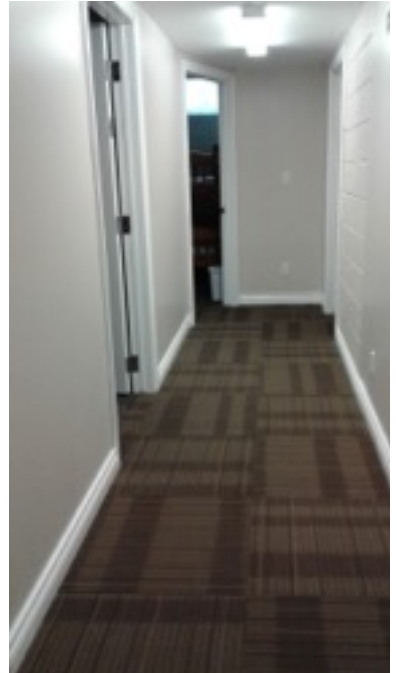

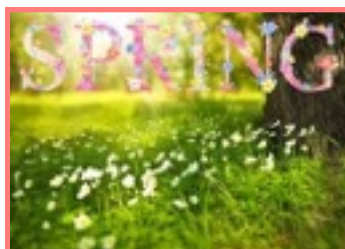
## Graham & Melodie Ghent

**REVIVAL** – Pastor Jacques Nadeau,  
Newcastle Baptist church, Ontario (pages 8-10)

According to a sidebar in Christian History Magazine, spiritual awakenings or revivals, whether in biblical history or in Church history, often manifest very similar patterns that are strikingly the same. Usually, the following spiritual elements are always present: first, awakenings

are often preceded by a time of spiritual depression, moral apathy, and gross sin, in which a majority of nominal Christians are hardly any different from the members of secular society, and the Churches seem to be asleep; second, an individual, or a small group of God's people, become so conscious of their sin and of their backslidden condition that they vow to forsake anything, and everything, that's displeasing to God in their lives, or that they know would grieve the Holy Spirit; third, as some believers begin to yearn for a manifestation of God's divine Presence and power, a leader or leaders arise, with great spiritual insight into the causes and remedies of the problem, and a new awareness of the holy and pure character of God begins to consume and grip the people of God, and it fills them with a holy fear of God, and with a passion to live the kinds of lives that are pleasing in His sight; fourth, the awakening of believers begins to occur; many Christians begin to understand and take part in a much more real and deeper spiritual life, and sinners are often converted to the Lord Jesus Christ because of the very strong sense of the Presence of the Spirit of God among His people; and fifth, an awakening or revival is often the very means that God uses to prepare and strengthen His people for the days of evil that are fast approaching them. Stephen Olford once said: "A revival is an invasion from Heaven that brings us a conscious awareness of God." Robert Coleman once said: "Revival is that sovereign work of God in which He visits His own people, restoring and releasing them into the fullness of His blessing." James A. Stewart once said: "Revival is the people of God living in the power of an un-grieved and unquenched Holy Spirit." And Brian Edwards once said: "In revival, the minds of the people are concentrated upon the things of eternity, and there's an awareness that nothing else really matters." I have become convinced, beyond any shadow of doubt, that a time of revival and spiritual renewal among the people of God is what the Church in North America, in this current day, so desperately needs. We need to be living in the power of an un-grieved and unquenched Holy Spirit; our faces need to grow pale, and we need to drop down to our knees and fall prostrate to the floor, as one believer goes to another believer, and confesses wrong feelings towards one another, and as the sins of pride, and anger, and bitterness, and envy, and jealousy, and lust, and hatred, and greed, and impurity, and dissension, and division, and strife, and rivalries, are not only openly confessed ...



... to Jesus Christ, but also, sincerely forsaken and renounced. We need to become so conscious of our sin, and so aware of the holy and pure character of our God, and of the call of the gospel, and of the Cross, that we would vow to forsake “anything and everything” that’s displeasing to God, and that would violate His holy will, as revealed to us, in Holy Scripture. Samuel Stevenson said it so well when he penned the words to the following poem:

“A city full of Churches, great preachers, lettered men;  
Grand music, choirs and organs, if all these fail, what then?  
Good workers, eager, earnest, who labor hour by hour;  
But where, O where, my brother, is God’s almighty power?”

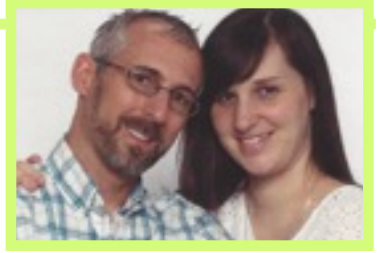
## Jeff & Jani Goudy

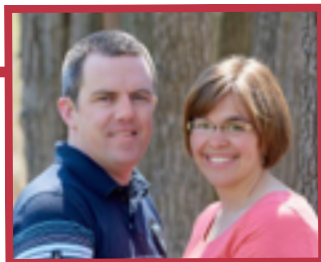
