Sam - I was raised in a Christian home by a mother of vibrant faith. Though God's hand was upon my life from birth, I did not come to a personal saving faith in Christ until I was 20 years old. From the age of 12 to 20, I lived in darkness and aimlessly went about life. I became a drug addict and immoral. I found myself homeless and lost. Though I can see now God was drawing me all along the way, it wasn't until I was invited to church that God touched my heart. God provided me with a job and He sovereignly led a lady to pursue me with the gospel. I gave my life to Christ. The drug addiction was immediately broken and I knew that I was forgiven and loved by God. I loved Jesus, the Bible and the local church. The direction of my life was changed. True hope and purpose now marked me in Christ.

Nicholette - I was born in Jamaica and with that came a cultural familiarity with Christianity. We attended church regularly but genuine Christian witness in reality was absent from our home. Upon coming to Canada, I found myself in the foster care system. Along with the tough life changes, I found myself inoculating my pain and loss of worth with fleshly desires, the world, and all that's in it. I thought I had respect for God by not directly taking his name in vain but in reality my life did just that. I became overcome with the fear of the dark and night terrors. When I saw a cross or dark clouds in the sky, I would think about the coming of Christ and the judgement. I knew my soul wasn't right to meet God. Not long after, my memory of the gospel returned. Upon believing in Christ, God delivered me. He saved me from my darkness and fears. The trajectory of my life changed as I followed my Saviour and found a home among the family of God.

Fifty years ago Tozer wrote, "The idea that this world is a playground instead of a battleground has now been accepted in practice by the vast majority of Christians." The statement is truer today than when the ink first dried. Civilization and culture have united to convince mankind that the greatest evil in life is missing out. On the one hand, civilization has - for us in the West - removed the grievances of the premodern world. On a typical Saturday, severe illness, famine, and war feel no more of a threat than iron chariots and longbows. On the other, pop culture repeatedly tells us that the highest aims of life are experiencing thrills, making memories, and having fun. Put ingredient one and ingredient two together and the world does not feel like a dangerous warzone, as depicted in the New Testament, but like a trip to Disney World. And every child knows that there are only three rules at Disney: have fun, be safe, and respect others.

A host of problems emerge from this illusion. First, with civilization keeping us safe and prosperous, and pop culture directing our passions and lifestyle, the need for 'god' (regardless of who you think he is) is reduced to that of a therapist and a life insurance policy. All we need from religion is something to boost our spirits when depressed and something to unlock the pearly gates after we die. Otherwise, 'god' does not factor into the life plan.

But, second, this playground mentality eliminates the need for earnest spiritual training. Rare is the child who prepares himself for the playground. Little boys do not do pull-ups in order to improve on the monkey bars. Little girls do not enrol in CrossFit to go faster on the Merry-Go-Round. The idea of rigorously training for the playground is every bit as ridiculous as the thought of getting a good night sleep before eating Chinese food. The goal of the playground is not to perform well, but to maximize fun before time runs out - before the teacher whistles or dad says, 'let's go!'.

The application of this ought to be clear. The more people succumb to the illusion that life is a quest for fun, the less they need God, and the more apathetic they are regarding temptation. The words of Peter begin to sound a little extreme, even paranoid: 'Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul' (2:11). Like the disciples in Gethsemane, men begin to sleep when they are supposed to be keeping watch. They forget about the prowling lion who is ready to pounce in the bush. This, I fear, is the condition of many Christians today.


