It has been a real privilege over these past 3 months to travel to various parts of Canada to meet with some of our workers and to see first-hand what God is doing in the various districts of our work. In early



March I was able to visit with the Perron's in Quebec for some days and to view potential homes for their re-location. We believe that God has guided and directed our steps and we are pleased to report that we have secured a new home for them in Saint-Sophie. (See their report) This will undoubtedly bring change for them and their young family, but we are confident that God will prepare the way, provide for them as a family, and give them new opportunities for ministry in Central Quebec. Then in early April I spent a week in the West visiting with our workers in Alberta and BC. What a joy to spend time visiting and praying with various groups whom Jeff & Jani Goudy seek to work with on a regular basis. It was also so encouraging to share at a Prayer Rally in Red Deer, AB with over 50 pastors and lay people who have a deep hunger for Revival and long to see God work in Central Alberta and Canada. It certainly challenged me and reminded me of the tremendous need in our land for a genuine, definite move of God's Spirit in our own hearts and in the church. Pray for their upcoming 'Thirsting for God' conference with Charles Price at the end of May, that God would work powerfully for His glory. Then as a family we travelled to Northern Ontario (early May) to share in meetings there with the Hardwick's. A highlight was seeing Christian's coming together in true fellowship and prepared to serve together for the sake of the Gospel. He was guite an unusual character, our old companion Fred of the Sands - innocent as a child, yet of high wisdom and true to the core. In early days he had been an ocean pilot, and now could tell rare stories of the sea, and particularly of how he ran the blockade in British ships during the American Civil War. In his old age he had settled down as a boat-hirer in one of our summer resorts; and it was the coming of Faith Mission Pilgrims (workers) to the place that brought to him "the life that is life indeed". Ever after they were dear to his heart, every member of their band. He was most regular and prompt at the prayer meeting and would often be the first to lead. In his prayer he never forgot to mention the Pilgrims and their work, and the termination would be: "And, when their labours on earth are ended, You do open the doors and the windows of heaven and take them in". The mental picture of them hauled in precariously over the window-frames could hardly fail to provoke a smile!

The doors, of course, are for access; but the windows are for the distribution of the Divine bounty. "Look, if the LORD would make windows in heaven, could this thing be?" asked the doubtful advisor when the prophet predicted that Samaria's sore famine would give place to plenty (1 Kings 7). The psalmist, again, poetically described God's provision in the wilderness in these terms: "Yet He had commanded the clouds above, And opened the doors of heaven, Had rained down manna on them to eat, And given them of the bread of heaven" (Ps.78:23-24). And the prophet, Malachi, in his oft-quoted passage, represents Yahweh as offering to open the windows of heaven and pour out on Israel a blessing beyond their capacity to receive. (3:10). But, owing to the people's waywardness, under the Old Covenant heaven is generally a shut heaven, a closed Paradise jealously guarded and withheld. Sometimes it is represented as clothed with blackness, hard and cold as brass, utterly unresponsive to the people's prayers. God is remote behind a veil, unheeding, and perhaps even unfeeling. Then arises the desperate cry: "Oh, that You would rend the heavens! That You would come down!" (Isa.64:1) A vigorous Divine intervention is called for. Why is it, one may ask, that we have no such cry in the New Testament – unless, perhaps, in the Apocalypse? The reason is that, while the Old Covenant shows us a veiled holy place and a shut heaven, the New brings us to opened heavens and the way into the holiest now made manifest. There is no need to pray 'God, rend the heavens' - the doors stand wide open!

When the Forerunner (John the Baptist) asked for the Lord how he was to identity the Messiah, he received the answer: "Upon whom you see the Spirit descending, and remaining on Him, this is He who baptizes with the Holy Spirit" (John 1:33). That was to be the Messiah's special and unique function, and this was how He was to be known. As Jesus stepped from the Jordan, praying, the heavens were opened and the Spirit was seen descending upon Him, and the Divine Voice bore testimony to Him. And the heavens were, from then on, rent heavens – open, accessible, generous beyond our highest need.

When the first little nucleus of disciples was beginning to gather round Him, Jesus said to one of them: "...hereafter you shall see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man." (John 1:51) That is to say, He represented Himself to be the anti-type of Jacob's ladder. It was in Him that communication between man and God was reopened and maintained. True, the disciples did not witness such ministry of angels in outward form; but constantly, in His ministry, they beheld open commerce between earth and heaven in manifold and wondrous ways. He was constantly speaking of His immediate relation to the Father, and ascribing to Him all His perfect virtues. His wise and holy words, and His marvellous deeds; and He affirmed that no man could come to the Father except through Him. But the door of access was open: He welcomed all prodigals back to the Father's home through His grace; and He insisted that the storehouses of the Divine wealth were available to all who were willing to apply. The heavens that were flung open when the Spirit came upon Him and equipped Him for His ministry remained open throughout it - and are still open!

Darryl Evans' Testimony



At 12, I started rebelling against God and against everything my parents had taught me. Together with my cousin, we made a conscious decision to forget about God, and do everything to enjoy life. Well, the rhythm of that non-christian life led me to abuse illegal drugs and alcohol, to steal, to lie, and to do unspeakable things. By age 18, I was renting a house with my cousin, doing whatever we wanted whenever we wanted. I was living 100% to the rhythm of the world, the flesh, and the devil. Despite having everything I wanted, I felt a tremendous emptiness in my inner being. I began to think a lot about suicide. Living my life my way wasn't satisfying

at all.

One evening in March 1973, a friend and fellow partier shared with me that Jesus had changed his life. I didn't understand it, but I was intrigued by the joy and transformation in his life. Days later, he invited me to special meetings where an evangelist shared the gospel. I couldn't sleep until

I had agreed to go. When the evangelist shared God's message, I felt like I was the only person in the room though there were hundreds of people there. Yes, I had heard the gospel before, thanks to my parents, but that night, my hearing and my understanding crisscrossed, by God's grace.

I knew I had to make a decision that night. The evangelist read John 10:10 "The thief (satan) does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I (Jesus) have come that they might have life, and that they may have it more abundantly."

That night I realized I had been dancing to the devil's rhythm and that he was stealing my life from me, killing and destroying me. Later that night, all by myself, I knelt beside my bed and cried out for Jesus to forgive my sins and give me the abundant life He was offering in John 10:10.

I begged Jesus to help me stop using drugs, breaking the law, and doing many other unmentionable things. God hears a sinner's heartfelt cry and



Jesus saves the lost. Since then, I have discovered this truth: when I am totally surrendered to Him, I am truly living life more abundantly.

Darryl & Joan Evans have served as missionaries in Chile and Bolivia many years before serving with Bible Studies by Mail in Las Cruses, New Mexico. Darryl is very quick to talk to everyone about Jesus, who transformed his life.
