Even with the restrictions etc. that are upon us these days, we praise God that the Word is going forward and people are hunger to hear the truth. May the Lord make us faithful and fruitful in the work He has called us to!

We trust you will be encouraged as you read how our workers are continuing to serve across Canada and the new opportunities that God is giving to them. Many of you are remembering the Hoover's as Myron walks through his battle with Cancer. It has been a hard road they will continue to covet your prayers for the days ahead. The Board of the Mission will also value prayer as they seek replacements for the Campbellville location and we hope you will make this a matter of prayer also. Emma is looking forward to hosting a Ladies Retreat at the end of May/June, which it looks like it will now be online at the time of going to print. We are however looking forward to hosting 4 Drive-In Services at the Camp (June - Sept.) which we trust you will be able to join us and invite others for this outreach. It's not a new thing to say that "our work continues to look different" than it did a year ago, but that still remains true. We continue to seek creative ways to allow people to interact with the living and active word of God. Our prayers continue to echo that of the Apostle Paul in 2 Thessalonians 3, that the word of God would speed ahead and be honoured. and that in doing so He would direct people into the love of God and the steadfastness of Christ. And so in that sense, nothing has changed for us in regards to this goal, simply the methods used to further it. Mark's partnership with Riverside Community Church has been modified slightly, as Pastor Pete Naylor has returned to take over the weekly Sunday Preaching but has asked Mark to do a mid-week preaching \ teaching service online each Wednesday morning, as well as the Thursday night online prayer meetings. After preaching through a series on "suffering" Mark is now leading this second series through the book of Galatians.

April participates in two mid-week local women's prayer and bible study online meetings, as well as a third meeting for personal growth.

We are pleased to see how God has been working in one local family, in particular, that has been reaching out to us regularly to discuss Christianity and spiritual growth and we would ask you to join us in praying for them. Pray specifically that the enemy would not swoop in and "steal" the seed that has been planted, that their faith would not be "choked out by the weeds" or cares of this world. And that the roots of their faith in Christ would truly go deep allowing them to grow and flourish both in and for Christ. We also are greatly rejoicing at the Lord's miraculous provision and clear divine intervention in rescuing the local Pentecostal Pastor's daughter from drowning. Our prayer is that this would open the eyes of our small community to the brevity of life and to the love of God through Christ. Several local conversations have already come out of this situation, and we pray for more. Please pray for open doors and open hearts.

EVEN IF HE NEVER TELLS ME WHY!

Charles Simeon, the eighteenth Anglican clergyman, based in Cambridge, urged his students not to be "System Christians" but "Bible Christians". I know what he meant. It strikes me as smug, and even arrogant, to think we can pigeon-hole Almighty God into neat packages that explain His character and workings. He is infinite, eternal, and altogether wise. He is beyond the complete understanding of we who are finite, limited by time, and fallen, so that we often act foolishly. What we know about God, is what He in His grace has chosen to tell us. We dare not impose on Him anything that is beyond what He has revealed to us. So, that leaves us often puzzled and wondering why.

Deuteronomy 29:29 gives us an insight as to what should be our reaction to this: "The secret things belong to the Lord our God, but the things that are revealed belong to us and to our children for ever, that we may do all the words of this law." The verse speaks of mystery and certainty.

MYSTERY - THE SECRET THINGS

There are things we will never be able to understand, or explain. There are concepts and incidents that are beyond us. Things that concern God, or are permitted by God; are His affair, and may be left with Him. I do not know any more powerful piece of English prose than those written by Jewish writer Elie Wiesel. He was born in Sighet, Transylvania in 1928. Aged only 14 he was sent to Auschwitz and later to Buchenwald. Years later, he reflected on the first night in a concentration camp:

"Never shall I forget that night, the first night in camp, which has turned my life into one long night, seven times cursed and seven times sealed. Never shall I forget that smoke. Never shall I forget the little faces of the children, whose bodies I saw turned into wreaths of smoke beneath a silent blue sky. "Never shall I forget those flames which consumed my faith forever. "Never shall I forget that nocturnal silence which deprived me, for all eternity, of the desire to live. Never shall I forget those moments, which murdered my God and my soul and turned my dreams to dust. Never shall I forget these things, even if I am condemned to live as long as God Himself. Never."

How many of us, in times when despair and darkness overrides all the joys of living, and worst of all, when God seems distant, have felt similar feelings to Elie Wiesel?

"Why did the illness come?" "Why did the relationship fail?" "Why do I feel so alone?" "How long will all this last, because I can't take any more?" "God, where are you when I need you?" All these mysteries teach us:

• To be humble - we need to accept our limitations. We are tiny, though deeply significant, creatures in a vast universe. The God who spoke and out of nothing framed the worlds, is well able to bring order out of chaos. He is altogether loving and knows what He is doing.

- To be trusting we need to accept God's will. It may be that "darkness is my closest friend" (Psalm 88:18). In fact in all the psalms, some of which express deep heaviness, never once do we read the psalmist saying that he no longer trusts in God.
- To be thankful we need to accept that God knows best. If God is allowing us to be hurt, He will not waste the time or the tears. He will redeem each, and use them for our good and His purpose.

CERTAINTY - THE REVEALED THINGS

Despite all the unanswered questions and bewildering issues of life, we have the promises of God, which are totally reliable. Scripture says, "We know in part", but at least we do know! We know that there is a God. We know that He is infinitely loving. We know, too, that He is our Guide for faith and life. His love for us is demonstrated by the death of His Son Jesus, who carried our sins on the cross (Romans 8:32). We know that Jesus has conquered death by rising again, and has ascended and is exalted in heaven. We know that one day Christ will return to his rightful inheritance. We know that we are safe in His care... eternally. Over and above all that God is and has done, "He has granted to us His precious and very great promises". Just think on this one: "He will swallow up death for ever; and the Lord God will wipe away tears from all faces, and the reproach of His people He will take away from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken." (Isaiah 25:8)

The things revealed enable us to cope with the things we don't know! And the things revealed are told to us, not to gratify our curiosity, but that we may trust and obey God. I have heard a handful of sermons, which to me etched an indelible impression on my mind. They are unforgettable. One such was from Steve Brady who speaking on John 13:7 had three straightforward points: 1. Be glad for what you do know, 2. Be humble for what you do not know, 3. Be patient for what you do not know. When my good friend, Prof. Verna Wright was himself dying of cancer, he quoted to his daughter, who also had cancer, the words of the hymn:

> "I am not skilled to understand What God has willed; what God has planned; I only know at His right hand Stands One who is my Saviour."

There is certainty here – God is our Saviour; but there is mystery, too – He sometimes hides Himself from us, but we can trust God in the darkness. Though God may be distant, He is never absent. He promises His presence and will never, no never, forsake us. This we do know!

Being in the community a bit over a year now, we have a greater sense that this is our community, our people and therefore our responsibility to make God known to them. These frequent conversations have boosted a sense of trust that a few parents frequently allow their children to come over for play dates, have picnic lunches, and join them for walks. As you may already know, our daughter, Juliette, has a flawless knack for introducing us as Christians; so within a few minutes of the introduction. it is made clear who we are, which makes talking about God all the easier. Nicholette still has some growing pains in that area but she is willing to embrace it. As more homes are being built with

a school underway, she hopes that gradually our home will become a hub for genuine community relationships and gospel conversations. Until then, she is talking with a neighbour about possible ways to make God more known in the community as well as praying online regularly with our church for God to work.

Currently, we are preparing a lesson for online VBS for this summer and we have connected with 4 local churches thus far who are interested in using it. Also, Nicholette will be looking forward to seeing you ladies at the upcoming Women's one day retreat online on Saturday, May 29th. Sam continues gospel labour in Caledonia, the team had made great headway before the stay-at-home orders, in spite of them they faithfully conduct weekly prayer walks through the communities for the seeds to grow. Since January 2020 Sam has been engaged in preaching and teaching weekly. It has been sanctifying. He completed a series on the Beatitudes in April and continues teaching a 9 week series on the Doctrine of Scripture. He is beginning (May) a new sermon series on The Church and the Gifts of Grace. As he says, "the church has its origin in God and it is glorious," that has sadly been forgotten. He continues to meet and pray weekly with the Key Bible Club group, and with local pastors too.

With summer around the corner the hope is for Faith Mission Campbellville summer day camps, and evangelism and open-air preaching events in some new areas. These days have been strange, but the Lord has used them to ignite a renewed sense of love for and utter dependence upon Him and love for the gathered church and means of grace.
