When writing this update, I was drawn again to a passage in Psalm 126 which I preached on recently to a congregation. I was struck again by the opening three words: "When the Lord..." this makes all the difference! The people of God had been in Exile, torn out of their nation because of sin; but 'When the Lord' stepped in they were Restored, they Rejoiced and they were Revived. Maybe we feel that over these past 18 months we have 'lost' so much and we want to get back to 'normal'! But as the Lord reminded me again through this Psalm, we do not need to go back to 'business as usual' – we need (I need!) a fresh and real visitation from the Lord to Restore us again to Himself and Revive His church with life and power!

We are coming with 'rejoicing' in all that God has enabled us to do this summer and for your vital part in standing with us in prayer as we have endeavoured to go forth with the Gospel. Both our camp centres in Ontario and BC were able to run Residential and Day Camps this summer with many kids and youth impacted through this outreach. We had children coming for the first time and some never been to a Christian camp before! So many encouraging emails and comments from parents who were so thankful for what was taking place and kids reluctant to come to camp, went away 'reioicing' and many deeply impacted by the Word. One young girl at the Campbellville Camp, who did not come from a Christian home, went back and shared with her Mom all the 'Wordless Book' lesson and how she needed to hear this!! What an impact even a child can have in a family! Pray on for the precious seed that was sown in young hearts and for lasting fruit to remain as a result. We are also thankful for our own FM staff and summer staff who served so faithfully during the 3 weeks of camp and were greatly used of God.

The Campbellville Centre is now open for overnight Residential use and we are glad to now welcome back groups for retreats and conferences etc. This has been a long time coming but we are trusting God for greater days ahead for the Centre and for the work of the Mission right across Canada. This will be the last update that the Hoover's will be featured in as they now prepare to move at the end of September. We want to express our deepest thanks and gratitude to both Myron & Janet for their faithful service these past 8 years and for their fellowship in the work of the Mission. They will be missed and we want to uphold them in praver as they now move to this next step, not knowing all that lies ahead, but knowing who goes before them. As a Mission we ask for your prayers for a suitable couple to fill this vacancy of Camp Managers and that very soon they may be in place to take on this vital ministry here at Campbellville. You will see from the Falkland news that our Camp there had to Evacuated in early August due to the forest fires in BC. They have since returned but as of going to print, they are uncertain what these next days will hold and when they can have groups return to the camp. Please make this a matter of definite prayer!

As a Mission and Board, we will value your continued prayers and support as we go into this Fall and Winter season and what the Lord would have for us. We look forward to our Ontario and Quebec staff being together Sept. 19-21 for staff meetings. May the days that lie ahead be greater than what are behind us!

During July, two of our workers [Janice Evans & Jeff Goudy] lost their fathers quite suddenly, and we continue to uphold them in prayer. Also, some of you will remember Hester Rendall (nee

Dougan) who served for over 35 years with FM in Canada. Just before going to print, we received the news that Hester went to be with the Lord whom she served and loved. She left a tremendous legacy of faithfulness which we will be eternally grateful for.

Upon returning home from Greenwood, April got a call from Conan at the BC camp center with a request to come to teach for the week due to a death in the Evan's family. She was thankful to be able to go and spend a week alongside the staff at the camp and get a feel for what the ministry in BC looks like. As we write this, we are continuing to plan for one more VBS here in Larder Lake. We will be attempting a completely outdoor program and we are excited to see what the Lord does!

As churches began to open up, the calls for Mark to preach began to come in again. We continue to travel to each church as a family, and it has been exciting for all of us to see some familiar faces, and also meet some new people who we haven't connected with before. In particular, we have reconnected with Northern Lights Baptist Church in Iroquois Falls who are without a pastor. Please keep this small church in your prayers as they search. As we look towards the fall it is encouraging to hear talk of a number of churches desiring to work together in different children's ministries. We would value prayer for the planning stages of these programs and for direction for us as to where we are to serve. We thank you for your prayers for the families that we are discipling here, it is so encouraging to watch the Lord work in their lives and direct their decisions.

It is hard to believe that summer has come and is almost over! In our last update we shared that we had the opportunity to teach at 2 weeks of English day camp at Camp des Iles. Camp was really the start of our summer and we were so excited to have the opportunity to teach in person again. Our first week started off with the realization that at least half of the kids that were attending camp didn't speak any English at all. And while some of the kids were bilingual there were a number who really didn't speak any French so in order that the gospel might go forth we had to teach in both English and French. But God is so faithful and even though we hadn't prepared to teach in French God was with us and we knew His help. The children were attentive and listened well and the second week we were able to teach only in English as the French only kids were not there the second week. At the end of the week the camp director shared that there were a number of kids who were from unchurched homes who had started to pray during the week and were really showing in interest in what they were being

taught. One girl even prayed with her leader to ask Jesus to come into her life. We praise God for this and pray that God would give more opportunities for these kids to learn more about Jesus.

This leads us to a prayer request. A good number of the kids that attend camp also attend the English elementary school in Lachute, including the little girl that prayed with her leader. With this in mind, our hearts have once again been thinking about the Bible Explorers program that had to end early in March 2020 because of Covid and wasn't able to restart this past year as the school wasn't allowing any extracurricular activities. We would really like to see this program back up this fall offering kids a chance to hear God's Word on a regular basis. Please pray with us that God would open the door to minister once again with the children of Lachute and that He would provide the help necessary to run the program. Many of the helpers from previous years all have babies but we trust that God will provide all that is needed for His work. Please pray that God would also give us clear direction for how we can better serve Him and His church this fall, especially as some restrictions are beginning to lift.

ADDRESS ON REVIVAL

by Rev. Duncan Campbell

WILL YOU NOT REVIVE us again: that Your people may rejoice in You? (Psalm 85.6)

These words of the Psalmist express the heart-cry of many of God's children today. There is a growing conviction everywhere, and especially among thoughtful people, that unless revival comes, other forces will take the field. With that conviction there is also a deepening hunger for a fresh manifestation of God. The prayer of many can be seen in the Prophet's words: "Oh that You would render the heavens and come down". Yet today, we have a Christianity made easy as an accommodation to an age that is unwilling to face the implication of Calvary, and the gospel of 'easy believism' has produced a harvest of professions which have done untold harm to the cause of Christ. We use all the modern means and facilities for the propagation of the gospel, but as we look back over much activity in church work and witness, what do we see? Not flags of victory but gravestones of defeat! So we are today faced with the need pressing and urgent - for God to manifest His power: the need of a God-sent Holy Ghost revival.

THE ORIGIN OF REVIVAL

"Will You not...?" We do well to remember that in the whole field of Christian experience, the first step is with God: thought, feeling, and endeavor must find their basis and inspiration in the sovereign mercy of God. To me, one of the most disturbing features of present-day evangelism is the over-emphasis on what man can do, and I believe this to be the reason why we so often fail to get men and women to make the contact with Christ that is vital. The Apostle Paul puts it in clear light in his letter to the Galatians, when he writes: "it pleased God to reveal His Son in me." The fact of ultimate reality, surely, is this, that salvation is of God. He is the God of revival, and we must look to Him and to Him alone. I have already referred to the cry of the prophet Isaiah -- his convictions were that the mountains would flow, and nations would tremble only when God came down. In other words, he is just saying that nothing will happen unless there is a mighty demonstration of God. It is my own deep conviction that the average man is not going to be impressed by our publicity, our posters or our programs, but let there be a demonstration of the supernatural in the realm of religion, and at once man is arrested. I have seen this happen over and over again during the recent movement in the Western Isles. Suddenly an awareness of God would take hold of a community, and, under the pressure of this divine presence, men and women would fall prostrate on the ground, while their cry of distress was made the means in God's hand, to awaken the indifferent who had sat unmoved for years under the preaching of the gospel.

THE AGENCY OF REVIVAL

"Will You not revive us again that Your people...?" God is the God of revival. But we must not believe in any conception of God's sovereignty that nullifies man's responsibility. We are the human agents through whom revival is possible. To say, as so many do, "We can do nothing," may be a very accommodating doctrine to "them that are at ease in Zion", but it will not stand in the light of Divine revelation. Samuel Chadwick, in his book 'Humanity and God', writes: "The operation of Divine sovereignty and the freedom of human will are not irreconcilable to the wisdom of God. Our responsibility is not in the explanation of mystery, but in obedience to obligation and privilege."

I wonder if we are really alive to our responsibility and privilege. I have read that Robert Murray McCheyne had the picture of the setting sun painted on the dial of his watch, and underneath written, "*The night cometh*". Every time he looked at his watch, he was reminded of his responsibility as a minister of the gospel. If we study the life of the early disciples, we see how their whole being was animated and actuated by one great purpose -- to be at their best for God.

I am disturbed by the attitude of the Church in general toward evangelism or revival. By evangelism I do not mean just an effort to get people back into the Church; this effort, while commendable, does not get us very far. What I mean is something much more: it is the getting of men and women into vital, saving and covenant relationship with Jesus Christ, and so supernaturally altered that holiness will characterize their whole being. It seems to me that the time has come when we must, with open mind and true heart, face ourselves with unqualified honesty and ask the question: "Am I alive to my responsibility as a labourer in God's vineyard?" How easy it is to live more or less in the enjoyment of God's free grace, and yet not realize that we are called to fulfil a divinely appointed purpose. So what, then, is the essential to recovery and revival? Surely a whole-hearted desire to be right with God, to stand before Him in an adjusted relationship and to say with Hezekiah of old: "Now it is in mine heart to make a covenant with the Lord God of Israel."

THE OUTCOME OF REVIVAL

"Revival," said Professor James S. Stewart, "is a new discovery of Jesus": God becoming real in the midst of men. I have known the Spirit of God laying hold of a community in such a way that you would hardly meet a person that was not seeking after God. Is it not of the reality of God's presence in revival power that Paul is writing --"For God who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, has shone in our hearts, to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ"? Brethren, is this light visible in us? Are our lives, are our churches, lights that mark the road that leads men to the Lamb?

"Perishing, Perishing! Thou wast not willing; Master, forgive, and inspire us anew; Banish our worldliness, help us ever to live with eternity's values in view."

May God help us to make this our prayer!

This Fall, we anticipate a number of rental groups, as well as 4 One-Day Ladies Retreats Sept. 24, 25, Oct 1, 2, and a Marriage Enrichment Retreat Oct 15-17. Christmas in the Valley banquets are scheduled for Nov. 24-27. Thank you for your prayers and support. Please continue to pray for ministries in Falkland area this Fall.
