We have been reading a biography of pioneer missionary, John G Paton, with our children in the evenings. He went to a people who were blood thirsty warriors and cannibals. He patiently endured their constant lies and thievery, and many attempts to kill him and his family. In spite of it, his love endured for the South Sea tribes he lived among and labored to reach. John experienced many losses and pains, but also miraculous deliverances and glorious conversions. After years of building an entire mission station and ministry from scratch, he had to leave. Shortly after, he went to another Island and started the work again. One night, a fierce storm arose and destroyed the church and schools they just built. Rather than get discouraged, they got right back to work. "The Lord gives and the Lord takes away, blessed be his name" (Job 1:21-22).

It can be easy to get discouraged these days and say what is the point of rebuilding but it is our

prayer that God's love will shine through us and we would decidedly put our hand to the plough. Right now, in Southern Ontario, we can say the fields are ripe for harvest but the laborers are few. There is more need than ever. In the past two months, five churches that are without pastors have reached out for preaching support. There are hundreds of people moving into Mount Hope and Caledonia and the surrounding areas who need to hear the gospel. We have an increasing elderly population that need care and gospel ministry. In Hamilton, there are more children in social service care in need of a loving home and less foster caregivers than ever to accommodate them, according to Hamilton Child and Family Supports. We continue to pray and look for how we can engage this field the Lord has placed us in. As of now, we are regularly ministering to the congregation, Assembly of Friends, in Hagersville. Sam has completed a 10-week series on Fasting. Our prayer is that the church will put what they've heard into practice. Sam will also be preaching at 3 or 4 different churches starting in September. We anticipate ongoing ministry in song and scripture reading at nearby senior retirement centers. This summer of ministry has been rewarding. Sam and Juliette helped with practical needs at the centre. And Nicholette taught in the evenings for the first time at Discov-

ery Camp. The kids loved her Jamaican accent as she told the story. As we look toward September as a family, we appreciate your prayers for us as we continue the exciting journey of homeschooling our 4 children. Our son has begun to read! Our youngest girl is next. Pray we will thrive this new study year.

INTERVIEW WITH LIBBY HARDWICK

FM Summer Intern

What were some of the highlights of your internship?

I really loved camp and getting to know all the new counselors and also getting to know the old counselors a little bit better and just building the relationship between staff. The other highlight was being part of the Faith Mission staff meetings and Thirsting for God. I liked getting to know the staff a bit better and seeing what happens during staff meetings because I've never been part of a staff meeting before. I enjoyed getting to serve alongside people and seeing everybody's excitement for the work. I have looked forward to being part of VBS programs and assisting churches in reaching children in their community.

How did you see God at work during this time?

At camp, when we saw so many kids asking questions and being curious. Many are from Christian homes and some pastors' kids who maybe felt more comfortable to ask questions during camp and have their questions answered. Being there to answer these questions and seeing how God has answered their questions through the devotion times. Like when kids would pray and ask God to save them or ask how they could be saved – this was awesome! Seeing how our counselors have come back from last year and how they have grown in their faith was great. I loved camp! Knowing that I can trust God in all situations and having the confidence to go places was cool.

I also saw God at work when I was asked to speak at a youth group in Eastern Ontario (with Laura-Anne) which was my first time publicly teaching and speaking. Getting to see how God used me and that the words got them thinking and spoke to them.

What is ahead for you in the Fall and how can we best pray for you?

I'll be going to Georgian College in the Fall and living in Barrie and commuting to Orillia for that. I am taking the DSW (Development Service Worker) course which I hope will help me learn, with God's help, how to make a safer world for those with disabilities in a world that wasn't designed for them.

The ways that you can best pray for me would be: (1) it will be my first time permanently living away from home. So that'll be a vibe!! (2) I have a new friend who is in the beginnings of her Christian journey. So pray for me and her that I would have words to say and for any questions that she has. (3) that I would find a good church to be a part of when I am at college and to take my friend along.

Thank you Libby for serving with us this summer and we will certainly be praying for you as you embark on this next adventure with God!
